Location & Accommodations

CONFERENCE LOCATION: The conference will be held in the Sweetgrass Pavilion on Wild Dunes Resort, located at 5803 Palmetto Drive, Isle of Palms, SC 29451. The resort can be reached at 800-845-8880 or 843-886-6000. Visit www.wilddunes.com for more information.

ROOM BLOCK: Wild Dunes offers a wide variety of accommodations from hotel rooms to suites to villas to beach houses. The SCAPA room block consists of hotel-type rooms in the Boardwalk Inn and the Village at Wild Dunes at a rate of \$174, which is subject to 11.5% tax, 4% resort fee, and \$1 destination fee. Rooms have been blocked for the nights of Saturday (Oct 9), Sunday (Oct 10), Monday (Oct 11), Tuesday (Oct 12), and Wednesday (Oct 13). The conference rate is also available for the two nights preceding Saturday and the two nights following Wednesday, but these additional nights are based on availability and cannot be booked using the online reservations method. If you are planning to arrive before Sunday, stay past Thursday, or if you want to inquire about other types of accommodations, you should make your reservations as soon as possible by calling the 800 reservations number and speaking to a Wild Dunes representative.

The Boardwalk Inn is a AAA Four Diamond-rated hotel located just steps away from the beach and the Sweetgrass Pavilion. The Inn features a swimming pool, lounge, and restaurant and was completely refurbished in March 2008. Guest

rooms reflect warm, sophisticated Southern Lowcountry style and are outfitted with wireless Internet access, new bedding, window treatments, furniture, carpeting and flat screen televisions.

The Village at Wild Dunes®, the newest addition to Wild Dunes accommodations, is located next to the Sweetgrass Pavilion and steps from the beach.
